


Evangelism, p. 161 - here it is.

What does that mean? Do we need strong men who can print a lot of books? **look at this next quote** -->

#### testimonies, vol. 4, p.389

"the press is a power; but if its products fall dead for want of men who will **execute plans to widely circulate them**, its power is lost... Hundreds of men [and women] should be engaged in carrying light all through our cities, villages, and towns."

using the advantage of the press means making plans to distribute the literature and **ACTUALLY** following through with it.


Literature in your car never saved any souls. Tracts in your church's cabinets never brought anyone to the truth.

As powerful as books and tracts are, they don't do any good unless they are distributed to the people!

#### James White, 1856

"The press is a mighty engine, let it do its work, and save the lungs... you may do the people much more good, and still save your lungs and your breath, by getting them to read."

### James White said this in 1856:



an even better idea than being involved yourself: get your whole church involved in literature distribution!


the church's most successful periods are when lay members, not just colporteurs and pastors, we doing a large portion of the work.



the T&M society was really the organization that made it happen in the late 1800's as the church was rapidly growing.




these 2 levels are really where we focus on the GLOW program.




it's a progression. there's always room for growth and broader experience in literature evangelism. we can start off giving out tracts, but there's areas to move from there.


why do we focus on the first 2 levels?



really what we want to do with the GLOW concept is to remove as many objections as possible for people to become literature evangelists.

negativity plays a huge role. everywhere I go, people always seem to say "I was an LE. that's a very hard work" (or something like that).

how do you run a successful GLOW program at a local church?



example: Beaumont church dist. about 80,000 tracts in their first year. every church in conference did that - 13.7 million a year

- Check in with the GLOW literature evangelists and see how they are doing.
- Find out how they are doing with the commitments they have made for distributing literature.
- Offer encouragement to them, especially those involved in level 2 or higher.

- See if they have any exciting experiences to share.
- Pray with them


- Recruit new GLOW Literature evangelists.
- Arrange for regular (weekly if possible) testimony time in church to share GLOW experiences. There is a GLOW Weekly Testimony email sent each friday to provide a GLOW story to share if needed.

- Organize literature distribution for the church:
- Sabbath afternoons in the church's community.
- Level 1, Level 2
- At events in the area, such as large gatherings you can pass out literature as the people exit.
- Other


- Connect church with upcoming events, such as GLOW rallies, distribution events, etc.
- Get to know some of the benefits and principles of literature distribution, as discussed in books like Colporteur Ministry\* and Publishing Ministry.
- Order literature and supplies for the church when they are running low.

#### the start process

- Talk to the pastor
- Take proposal to church board
- Set a launch date to start the program
- Choose a local church leader
- Get literature
- GLOW!
